

Report on Fundraiser for the Treatment of Wounded and Sick Animals from the Frontline Regions 6.0

We spent **UAH 716,431.15 (≈\$16,963)** on assistance. The remaining **UAH 225.85 (≈\$5)** will be used in the next fundraiser for treatment

Just look at what we were able to do with the funds raised!

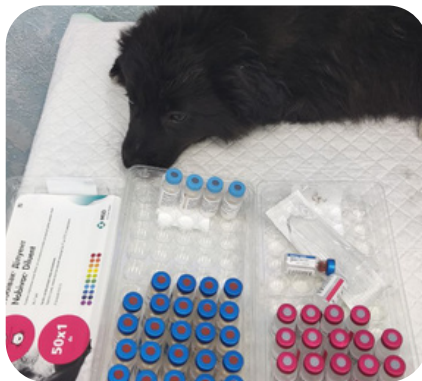
- 🐾 We helped 15 animals evacuated from frontline towns in the Donetsk region.
- 🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, feeding, spaying/neutering, vaccination, and parasite treatment for eight male and female cats from Bilytske. All of them have already recovered and moved to Homeless World rehabilitation center in the Kyiv region.
- 🩹 We paid for tail amputation surgery and wound treatment for another cat from the same trip – she is now at the same center.
- 🩹 We paid for tests for viral diseases, parasite treatment, and care for four puppies from Rodynske. After treatment, they were transported to Rudyi Pes shelter in the Ivano-Frankivsk region.
- 🩹 We paid for neutering, vaccination, and parasite treatment for a dog from Kostiantynivka named Rem.
- 🩹 We paid for eye and ear treatment, tests for viral diseases, injections, and parasite treatment for a cat from Rodynske.

In total, we allocated **UAH 90,304 (≈\$2,139)** to help these animals.



🐾 Together with you, we also paid for 30 doses of vaccines for puppies evacuated from the Donetsk region. Now they are all protected from dangerous viruses and can recover peacefully after what they have been through. These little ones are under the care of Zoofamily shelter in the Kirovohrad region.

We spent **UAH 8,520 (≈\$202)** on the purchase and delivery of vaccines.

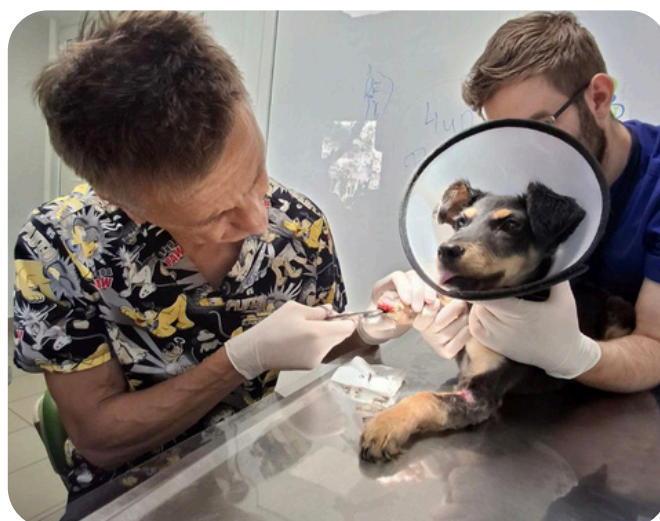


🐾 We also helped a **puppy named Filia**. Volunteers of the public organization Tobias. Animals of Kherson found him in terrible condition — maimed, with numerous injuries and burns. There was no way to help the little one in Kherson, so Filia was urgently taken to ExVet clinic in Odesa. There, a long and difficult fight for his life began.





Veterinarians surgically cleaned his wounds, performed surgery, and installed an external fixation device to set his bone. His condition was critical — Filia’s blood pressure was dropping, so he was given albumin. Despite severe fractures, burns, and purulent wounds, the veterinarians managed to stabilize him. We compensated the volunteers for the costs of purchasing albumin, ointments, and wound care products, which were delivered to the clinic. Filia underwent daily wound care, treatment with special bandages, and enzyme therapy for tissue healing.



The male dog stayed at the clinic around the clock, where he underwent a biochemical blood test, was given analgesics, antibiotics, hormonal, antifungal, and wound-healing drugs, infusion solutions, injections, and X-rays. Later, vitamins and a rabies shot were added.

At the end, we paid for a routine examination, treatment of postoperative sutures, and microchipping.

In total, **UAH 115,644 (≈\$2,739)** was spent on Filia's treatment.



🐾 Another animal who was saved thanks to you is a **dog named Iva**. We evacuated her from Ivanopillia in the Donetsk region at the soldiers' request. After the evacuation, Iva lived in a shelter for some time, but her condition suddenly deteriorated – the dog began to lose weight rapidly, so we urgently transferred her to a veterinary clinic.

At the clinic, the vets stabilized Iva's condition and conducted a full examination: a complete blood count and a biochemical blood test, parvovirus, heartworm, and giardiasis tests, and cytology. They prescribed anti-diarrhea and detoxification drugs, peristalsis stimulants, and infusion therapy. The results showed giardiasis, so Iva was prescribed treatment and a special diet. Thanks to the care of the veterinarians, the dog gradually recovered, began to gain weight, and her appetite returned.

After completing treatment, Iva was handed over to Myrnohrad Animals shelter in the Donetsk region.

In total, **UAH 22,004 (≈\$521)** was spent on Iva's treatment.





🐾 We eased the suffering of a **dog named Dobriak**. We evacuated this large but extremely gentle dog from Bilytske in the Donetsk region. He had been wandering the streets for a long time. It was clear that he once had a home — Dobriak is sociable, trusting, and incredibly gentle.

The residents of Bilytske turned to us with a request to save him. We couldn't get to the town on our own, so a volunteer who was involved in evacuating people agreed to help — he took the Alabai to Dobropillia, where we met him and immediately took him to a veterinary clinic.

Dobriak was in serious condition: the dog was exhausted, dehydrated, and had open wounds on his paws. At the clinic, he underwent a complete blood count, a biochemical blood test, heartworm testing, ectoparasite treatment, vaccination, and regular wound care.

We spent **UAH 13,572.22 (~\$322)** on Dobriak's treatment.



🐾 We rescued a **mother cat and her six kittens**. We evacuated this family from Sloviansk in the Donetsk region at the request of a soldier. Immediately after the evacuation, the animals were taken to a veterinary clinic. There, the mother underwent a complete blood count, a biochemical blood test, immunodeficiency and leukemia tests, vaccination, and parasite treatment. We paid for the kittens' clinic stay and initial examination to make sure they were all healthy.

After recovering at the clinic, the family was transported to Cats on Mars shelter in Kyiv.

We spent **UAH 5,002 (≈\$118)** to help the mother cat and her kittens.



🐾 We helped a **blind Yorkie named Morty**. Little Morty was found in the bushes of the frontline town of Dobropillia in the Donetsk region. His leash was weighed down with stones so that he couldn't escape. Volunteer Viktoriia noticed the dog and turned to us for help — we evacuated him. At the clinic, Morty underwent examinations, blood tests, lab tests, treatment of his eyes and wounds, was prescribed a special diet, and given antiparasitic drugs.

UAH 8,523.07 (≈\$202) was spent on Morty's treatment.

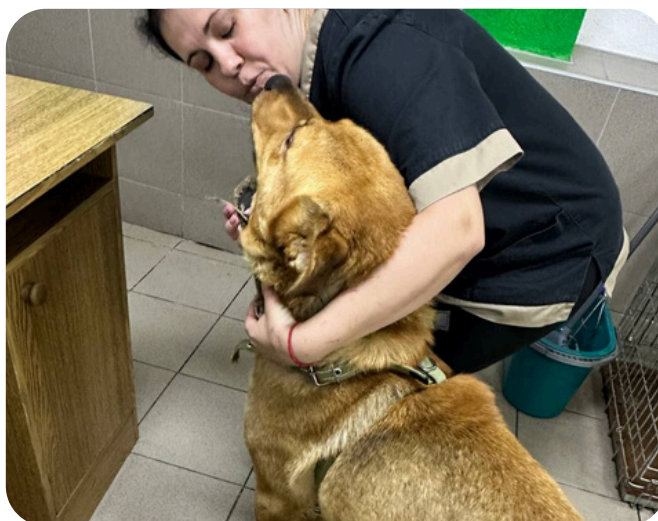




🐾 We paid for the treatment of **Sara, a dog evacuated from the Sumy region**. During the evacuation, tumors were found in her. Sara underwent surgery at the clinic, after which the veterinarians took care of her every day – treating her wounds and making sure everything healed properly. Once her condition stabilized, Sara was vaccinated. Sara is now feeling well and actively recovering. She was taken to Homeless World rehabilitation center in Bila Tserkva. We spent **UAH 14,838.05 (~\$351)** on Sara's treatment.



🐾 We helped **Malysh, a dog evacuated from Druzhkivka** in the Donetsk region. He had urinary incontinence, so veterinarians diagnosed cystitis and began treatment. The animal stayed at the clinic around the clock, underwent a complete blood count, oral cavity sanitation, treatment of postoperative sutures, and received injections. After the clinic, Malysh was handed over to Favorite Animal shelter in the Dnipropetrovsk region. We spent **UAH 10,064.85 (~\$238)** on the dog's treatment.



🐾 We helped **Lapa, a dog evacuated from Sydorove** in the Donetsk region. He was rescued by a soldier from the “gray zone” — the dog had a serious paw injury, and despite attempts to help him on his own, the damage turned out to be too complex. The soldier asked us to save Lapa, and we immediately transferred the animal to a veterinary clinic.

There, the dog underwent two surgeries. From this fundraiser, we paid for the third stage of his treatment: 24-hour clinic stay, injections, suture treatment, an ultrasound of the urinary system, surgical treatment of wounds with tissue suturing, a biochemical blood test, an X-ray, vaccination, catheterization, and oral cavity sanitation.

Over time, the animal began to stand on his injured paw.

We spent **UAH 37,635.67 (~\$891)** on the treatment of the dog Lapa.



🐾 We rescued a **mother cat and her five kittens**, who were evacuated from Krasnohorivka in the Dnipropetrovsk region at the request of a soldier. After the evacuation, the whole family was taken to a veterinary clinic, where treatment and examination began.

The cat underwent spaying, a blood test, polymerase chain reaction tests for viral diseases (immunodeficiency and panleukopenia), vaccination, parasite and wound treatments, and received injections. All the animals stayed at the clinic until the veterinarians were sure they were healthy.

After treatment, three kittens went to new families, and the mother cat with two kittens remained in the care of Favorite Animal shelter in the Dnipropetrovsk region.

UAH 28,060.43 (~\$665) was allocated to help this family.



🐾 We responded to a request of a volunteer from Kupiansk in the Kharkiv region, who asked for help for a **dog** who had been running around the town with a torn paw and had **seven puppies**. The volunteer managed to catch the animals and take them to our partner clinic. There, the dog's paw was amputated, and the puppies were examined and vaccinated. Now the mother and her babies are under the volunteer's care.

UAH 11,050 (~\$262) was allocated for assistance.





🐾 We paid for the treatment of **two cats, Niura and Matilda**, who were evacuated from Bilytske in the Donetsk region by Animal Rescue Kharkiv at our request. The animals were taken to a veterinary clinic in Dnipro, where they underwent blood tests, leukemia and immunodeficiency tests, ectoparasite treatment, and vaccination.

Both cats were successfully discharged after treatment, and now they are staying at Shas Spasu center in Kyiv.

UAH 12,148.75 (~\$288) was spent to help Niura and Matilda.



🐾 We paid for the treatment of a **dog named Malysh**, who was evacuated from Bilytske in the Donetsk region by Animal Rescue Kharkiv at our request. After the evacuation, the animal was taken to a veterinary clinic in Dnipro, where he underwent a blood test, was treated for ectoparasites, vaccinated, neutered, and had his stitches treated.

After treatment, the dog was handed over to his people in Ivano-Frankivsk.

UAH 11,671 (~\$276) was spent on Malysh's treatment.



🐾 We paid for the treatment of **Thomas, a cat evacuated from the Donetsk region**. At the clinic, he underwent a biochemical blood test for 19 indicators, a complete blood count, and received inpatient care, infusion therapy, and inhalation therapy. Thomas also had his teeth removed, underwent gingivoplasty, and received a detailed comprehensive visiography to completely restore the condition of his oral cavity. Thanks to the treatment, Thomas feels much better and is returning to normal life.

UAH 14,662.41 (~\$347) was spent on his treatment.



🐾 We paid for veterinary services for 36 dogs and cats evacuated from the Donetsk and Dnipropetrovsk regions.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, spaying/neutering, vaccination, parasite treatment, and postoperative suture care for two dogs from Kostiantynivka. Both have already been discharged and handed over to a shelter.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, vaccination, and parasite treatment for Rada, a dog from Dobropillia. After treatment, she was taken to a family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, vaccinations, and parasite treatments for two dogs from Pervomaiske named Liusia and Dina. Both now have new families.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, neutering, vaccination, ear and eye treatment, and postoperative suture care for Dima, a dog from Vodianske. The dog has already recovered and lives in a shelter.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, leukemia and immunodeficiency tests, vaccinations, and parasite treatments for three kittens from Vodianske. All of them were taken to a shelter.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, spaying, vaccination, postoperative suture care, and gave antiparasitic drugs to Ryzhulia, a dog from Novodonetske. She is now with her new family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and parasite treatments for several dogs from Dobropillia. All of them have been discharged and handed over to families or shelters.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, enteritis tests (positive result), and IV drips for two puppies from Kramatorsk. After a course of treatment, both were discharged and handed over to a family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and parasite treatment for Khaita, a dog from Mykolaivka. She is now with her new family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and vaccination for Berta, a dog from Vodianske. After treatment, she was handed over to Homeless World rehabilitation center in the Kyiv region.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and parasite treatment for Alex, a dog from Kramatorsk. He is also now with his new family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and initial examinations for two cats and one dog from Dobropillia. All of them have been discharged and handed over to families.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, spaying, vaccination, postoperative suture care, and gave antiparasitic drugs to Eva, a shepherd dog from Mykilske. She now lives with a family.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and parasite treatment for Malysh, a dog from Dobropillia. The dog is healthy and now lives at home.

🩹 We paid for the treatment for nine kittens from the Donetsk region in a viral unit.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and revaccinations for three puppies from Kramatorsk. They were handed over to Zoohelp shelter in the Kirovohrad region.

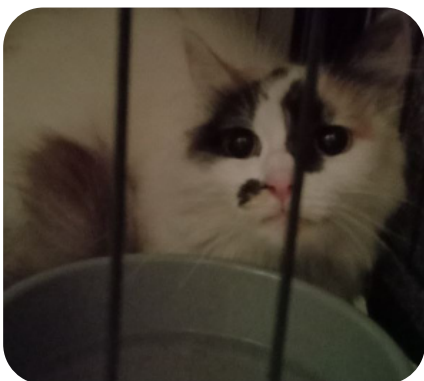
🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, spaying, vaccination, postoperative suture care, and parasite treatment for Rem, a dog from Kostiantynivka.

A total of **UAH 158,441 (~\$3,753)** was spent on helping these animals.



🐾 We paid for the treatment and vaccination of 32 evacuated animals — 20 dogs and 12 cats from Kupiansk and nearby towns. Volunteers handled the evacuation, and we covered the cost of veterinary services.

UAH 27,828 (~\$659) was spent on assistance.



🐾 We paid for and delivered 10 doses of vaccines and parasite treatments for the puppies evacuated from the Donetsk region, who are currently under the care of Zoofamily shelter in the Kirovohrad region.

UAH 3,203 (≈\$76) was spent on assistance.

🐾 We paid for the treatment of four kittens evacuated from Andriivka in the Donetsk region at the request of soldiers. At first, the little ones were handed over to Kotokhata shelter in Kyiv, but later they fell ill — discharge appeared from their eyes, and the animals refused to eat.

The kittens were taken to a veterinary clinic, where, after examination, they were diagnosed with a herpesvirus infection. We paid for the clinic stay, clinical examination, treatment of the viral infection, and vaccination. Thanks to timely treatment, the little ones recovered, were discharged, and returned to the shelter.

UAH 22,870 (≈\$542) was spent on the treatment of the kittens.



🐾 We paid for the treatment of two female cats and one male cat evacuated from Lyman in the Donetsk region — Masha, Pantera, and Sienia.

🩹 The cat Sienia was admitted to the clinic, where he was diagnosed with immunodeficiency. Vets treated a secondary infection of his eyes and respiratory tract, as well as performed a blood test, neutering, vaccination, parasite treatment, and removal of a spikelet from the soft tissues.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay and leukemia and immunodeficiency tests for the cat Pantera, who underwent an ultrasound of the abdominal organs, had a blood test, was vaccinated, given IV drips, sedatives, injections, fed special food, and treated for ectoparasites.

Tests for viral infections were negative, but due to stress and refusal to eat, veterinarians diagnosed triaditis syndrome — inflammation of the pancreas and bile ducts.

🩹 We paid for the clinic stay, leukemia and immunodeficiency tests, a blood test, parasite treatment, an ultrasound of the heart and abdominal organs, surgical treatment of a hernia, removal of a neoplasm with histology, IV drips, injections, wound and eye treatment, as well as removal of stitches for the cat Masha. After discharge, three animals were taken to Pegasus shelter in the Dnipropetrovsk region.

A total of **UAH 87,093.70 (~\$2,063)** was spent on all the veterinary services for the female cats and a male cat.



🐾 We paid for the clinic stay, postoperative suture treatment, and sedatives for Dina, a dog evacuated from Pokrovsk in the Donetsk region. The animal was taken away by soldiers, and we took care of her treatment and recovery. After the clinic, Dina was taken to Animal House Rescue shelter in the Poltava region.

UAH **8,568 (~\$203)** was spent on Dina's treatment.



🐾 We rescued little Basia from Orikhiv in the Zaporizhzhia region — the kitten was taken to the clinic with an injured paw. We paid for the clinic stay, vaccination, ear cleaning, and pet food.

After treatment, she feels well, and the soldier who rescued her took Basia home with him.

UAH 2,194 (~\$52) was spent on the kitten's treatment.

🐾 We rescued a dog named Vityok, who lived with soldiers at their positions. During shelling, he was frightened by the sound of an explosion and, in a panic, overturned a heavy bench onto himself, seriously injuring his paw. The soldiers handed their wounded friend over to volunteers, who took him to our partner clinic in Zaporizhzhia.

We paid for Vityok's treatment, specifically from this fundraiser — another **UAH 846 (~\$20)** for his clinic stay.



🐾 We rescued two kittens from Dobropillia — **Beth and Blackie**. The little ones were taken to the clinic, where they were examined and vaccinated. After treatment, the kittens were handed over to Animal in Love shelter in Kyiv, which took them for additional examination and vaccinations. Now both animals are healthy and have found their families.

UAH 1,687 (~\$40) was spent on Beth and Blackie's treatment.



Thanks to you, 155 animals have been given a chance at a life free from suffering and pain! 22 of them have found their people, while the others live in warmth and care at shelters and rehabilitation centers.

Finally, we want to say that we see every donation. Some people donate 1 hryvnia (\approx \$0.02), others UAH 14,000 (\approx \$331), but they are all equally important. Remember, there is no such thing as a small donation.
