We spent **UAH 352,304.36 (≈\$8,491)** on assistance.

Remember how you donated to purchase and deliver kennels and enclosures for animals living in the Bilozersk Animals shelter? Well, all the work has been completed, and the residents have been allowed to check out their new living conditions 🥰



🚚 We delivered 16 kennels to the shelter:

- five large double kennels measuring 100 × 80 × 80 centimeters;
- five medium double kennels measuring 90 × 80 × 80 centimeters;
- six single medium kennels measuring 80 × 80 × 80 centimeters.



🚚 We also delivered four enclosures:

- one medium enclosure measuring 3 × 4.5 meters;
- three standard enclosures measuring 2 × 3.5 meters.



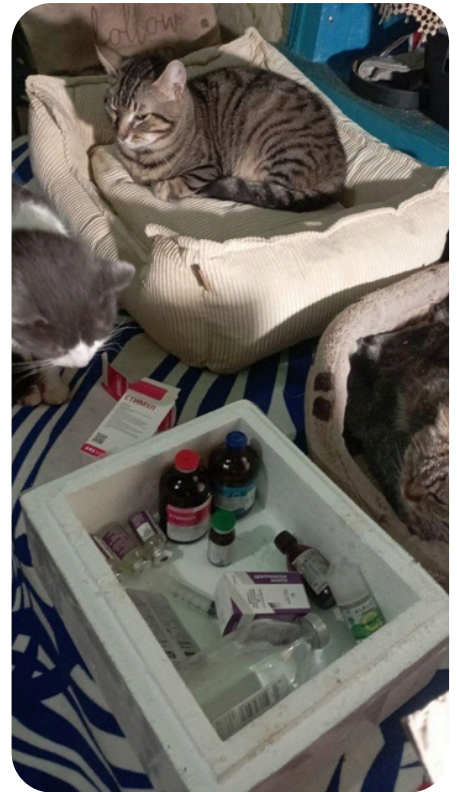
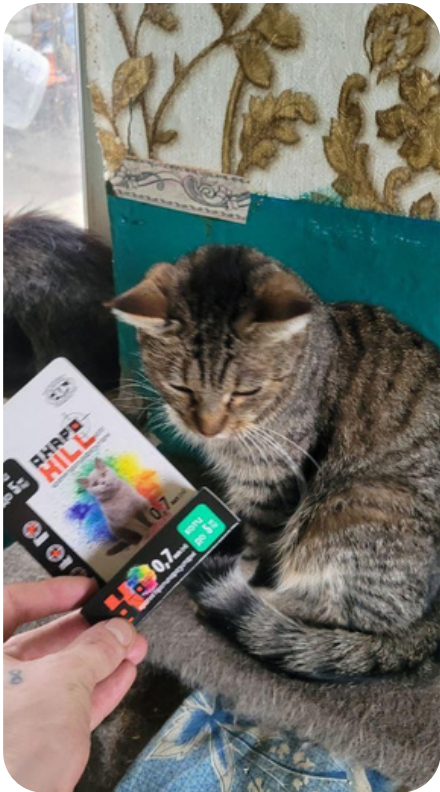
We spent **UAH 345,900 (≈\$8,336)** on the purchase and delivery of the kennels and enclosures.

🔹 The remaining money was used to purchase veterinary drugs for animals.

In particular:

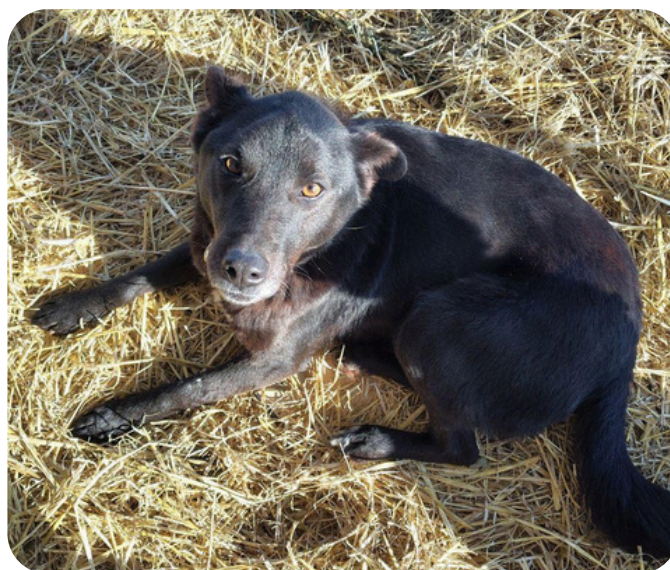
- antibiotics for the treatment of bacterial infections;
- flea and tick treatments for cats and dogs;
- drugs to support immunity;
- anti-inflammatory and restorative agents;
- injectable drugs for complex therapy.

We spent **UAH 6,404.36 (≈\$154)**.



Due to the enemy's advance and daily shelling of the city, the Bilozersk Animals shelter was forced to evacuate to the safer Dnipropetrovsk region. The shelter cares for 62 dogs and 93 cats.

«We haven't given up. And we're not going to», says Bogdan, the shelter's founder.
