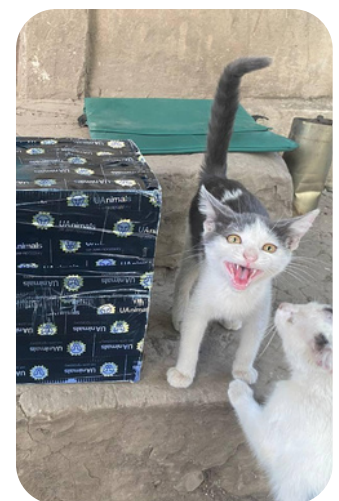

Thanks to your donations, we purchased dry food for cats and dogs, wet food for kittens, and parasite treatments for the animals under soldiers' care. We supported animals cared for by soldiers in the Donetsk, Kherson, Zaporizhzhia, Dnipropetrovsk, Kharkiv, and Sumy regions.

For example, we provided food for the animals cared for by soldiers in the Zaporizhzhia region. They have been caring for a dog named Ryzha for nearly a year.

There are also kittens living next to them. Frail and weak, some of them do not grow to their full size and remain stunted. The soldiers plan to take them to adoption centers in Kyiv, but for now, they are doing everything they can to help them regain strength.



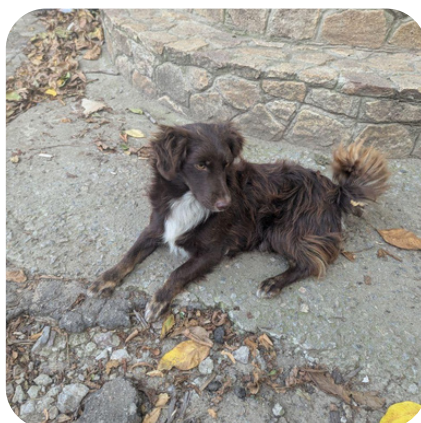
We also supported soldiers from the Donetsk region. The defender explains that a surprise awaited her brothers- and sisters-in-arms at their new position. There were several kittens. They were a bit wild and wouldn't let anyone hold them. They came out to eat, but even then, only to one person.

Adult cats stay nearby. They're also cautious, but they get along with the kittens. The soldiers feed them whatever they can, but due to difficult conditions, they don't always have the opportunity to cook.

That's why food for them is a valuable form of support.



We also helped the defenders in the Dnipropetrovsk region, who are caring for a whole group of abandoned animals. People left them behind in the village, and many animals are simply wandering the streets. The soldiers are trying to feed every animal that comes to them, but there isn't always enough food. That's why food donations are critically important.



We'd also like to share the story of a soldier from the Donetsk region. He has been helping animals since childhood, and even on the front lines, he hasn't stopped. Whenever possible, and if the animal is approachable, he evacuates it from the combat zone.

Near the frontline, where he lives, he regularly feeds stray dogs. He used to manage buying food on his own. But now it has become much more difficult. That's why he reached out for help, as the animals there cannot be left without food.



Friends, thank you for supporting those who are defending Ukraine against the Russian invasion and still find the strength to care for the most vulnerable. Together, we are giving these animals a chance to survive the war.
